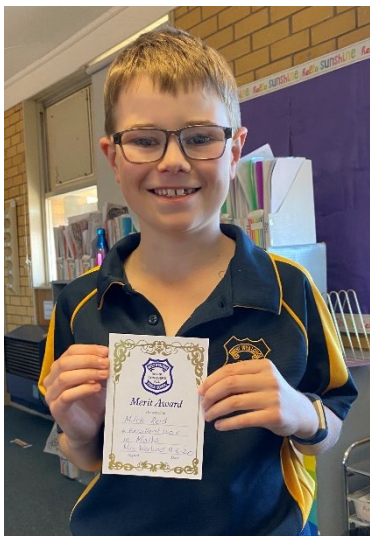

## Learning in 6 Yellow

Since returning to school full time 6 Yellow has been exploring ways to show resilience and ways to cope during a difficult time.



Students have looked at the Catastrophe Scale to identify where they feel common problems may fall, looking at the severity of the problem and possible solutions. They have learnt the importance of keeping their problems in perspective and to look on the bright side.



We have discussed introducing a new class motto of “be better than yesterday”. Students have also explored the benefits of mindfulness meditation on their mood.

Here is what the students have to say about

showing resilience:

Abby- think on the bright side, take time out to cool down and breathe nice and slowly.

Ella- When something goes wrong you will find a way to fix it and when things are tough always look on the bright side, even if you think it's not possible.
