It is hard to believe that we are nearly half way through the term. This week will be a very busy one, with the start of student goal setting through the parent-teacher-student interviews and the induction assembly for school leaders and a welcome to Kindergarten students tomorrow.

A huge congratulations to the West Wyalong Public School team of swimmers that competed last Friday, winning the highest point score. From all reports it was a great day with all competitors trying their best and representing the school with pride.

Last year, Miss Penfold organised the purchase of 47 new laptop computers. These computers have arrived and have been distributed out into all the classrooms. Most classes received 4 or 5 new laptops to add to the computers they already have. All students have a Mathletics user account and activities from this online program will be used during mathematics lessons.

The West Wyalong Public Student Use of Digital Devices and Online Services Procedures has been updated. It will be uploaded to the school website. The main guidelines are that all mobile and digital devices are not to be used during the school day unless it is for educational purposes. Mobile phones need to be taken to the front office each morning and collected at the end of the school day. If parents need to contact students they can do so by calling the front office and a message will be delivered to their child.

One of the highpoints of my day is when I have students are sent to my office with work they have completed in class. I have read a lot of "sizzling starts" of students who are improving their creative writing by having their story start in an interesting way. Kindergarten students have also visited with their sound work and are very proud that they know the letters "a, s and t".

I hope you all enjoy getting a better understanding of your child's goals in the three way interviews this week as it is an encouraging opportunity to take an active role in your child's learning.

What happens if my child damages a library book that belongs to the school?

If you have younger children at home, please help your child keep their library books away from them when unsupervised. Most damage to our library books is caused by pre-schoolers. If damage does occur **PLEASE DO NOT REPAIR IT.** Just ask your child to tell Mrs Grimshaw when they return the book to school so that the damage can be repaired promptly. Mrs Grimshaw has special materials in the library for this purpose.

Some children may be reluctant to point out damage for fear of being punished but this does not happen. The sooner the damage is noticed, the sooner the book can be repaired ready for another child to borrow.

Also would you please reinforce the following points when library books are being used at home:

- turn pages carefully by the corner
- have clean hands
- always use a library bag for library books

Registration is free and easy.



YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR YOUR CHILDREN'S SAFETY WHEN THEY ARE TRAVELLING TO AND FROM SCHOOL.

Safe bus travel

A child is most at risk of harm just after getting off the bus.

To reduce risk:

- meet your children at the bus stop never on the opposite side of the road
- hold your children's hands at the bus stop
- stand a few steps back from the edge of the road when waiting at the bus stop
- wait until the bus has gone, then choose a safe place to cross the road.

Help your children to find a safe place to cross such as:

- at a pedestrian crossing or traffic lights, if available
- a clear section of road where they are visible to all traffic.

If you can't be with your children, organise for a trusted adult to meet them at the bus stop.

NSW GROUP IS NOW ENROLLING


