From the Principal's Desk

Welcome to Week 2. Yesterday I was fortunate to be able to march with the students for the West Wyalong ANZAC Day ceremony. I was very impressed by the number of students that attended from our school and thank parents for their support, especially being a Sunday. A special thank you to Mrs Haub for the ANZAC tribute at the front of the school. All students created a poppy that was then attached to the front fence.

Over the next 4 weeks, there will be a lot of testing in English and Maths for students from Years 3-6 as well as assessments for all students for their school reports. What can parents do to help? Children usually need extra nurturing, comfort and understanding from their parents and carers to help them feel secure and confident during this time. Encourage your child to talk about how they feel and let them know you believe they can do it, and encourage them to 'have a go' even if they are feeling nervous. Providing positive feedback for effort, celebrating successes and encouraging them to keep trying will help your children to feel confident about the approaching assessments. Show your child how you cope positively with feeling anxious or stressed by thinking out loud e.g., "I feel a bit nervous, but I'm going to try my best".

All parents will receive an information letter today about what students will be learning in Term 2 and also a copy of their class timetable. Last term, parents indicated that they would like to know more about what students were learning each term and what their timetable was for each day. We hope that this information is helpful and if you would like to know anything else, please contact your child's class teacher via the office.

Next week, the P&C will run a Mother's Day stall for students on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday morning, from 8.30-9.00am. The gifts will range in price from \$2.00-\$8.00. If you would like your child to purchase from the stall, please send them with some money on one of these days.








First the boys had to select their branch before carefully debarking.

Maths





Students in Year 2 have learn't two different strategies to help them solve addition and subtraction problems. *Bridging to ten* and *the jump strategy*. What clever mathematicians we have in Year 2.

Bridging to ten requires students to use their knowledge of pairs of numbers that make ten or the **friends of ten** to help them solve larger problems. For example 8+5 students will work out that 8+2=10 so then they just need to add 3 more to get an answer of 13.










The Jump Strategy requires students to count on a number line by tens and then add the units to help them solve larger problems. For example 43+34 = students will start with the larger number of 43 and count on by tens 53 63 73 then add the units 74 75 76 77 to get an answer of 77.

...in Friday Coding Club

Friday Coding Club is part of our Friday afternoon Special Interest Groups, An intrepid and highly enthusiastic group of students from Year 3 to 6 have been learning to use two coding programs - Scratch and Dance Party from Code, Org, Each week we learn how to write small pieces of code to make objects move, dance or sina.

Scratch is a beginner level coding program that teaches students the basics in coding. We started off with scratch because it is simple to use and gave us a great opportunity to also learn how to 'de-bug' our code when it didn't work the way we wanted to.

Dance Party is definitely a favourite of the group, as it allows them to choose popular dance songs and write a code for their 'sprite' to dance to using the latest dance moves!

This term we will be learning how to use Robotify, We are very excited about this because we will be writing code to program virtual mars rovers and drones.
